Cuban-born René Izquierdo is a unique artist and passionate educator whose career has been dedicated to inspiring individuals and connecting communities. Whether passionately performing on stage, devotedly mentoring his students, fundraising, or leading community outreach, René's multi-faceted approach endeavors to continue creating experiences that enrich people's lives and add beauty to our world.

René has firmly established himself as one of the world's classical guitar virtuosos. He is celebrated for his ability to weave an unparalleled technical command of his instrument with his gift of storytelling, accomplishing an intimate musical experience with his audience.

With over seventy engagements per year, whether as a solo performer, chamber musician, or as a guest soloist with orchestras, he has performed to critical acclaim touring extensively throughout the Americas, Europe, and Asia. He is frequently invited by renowned festivals and institutions, having played at stages such as Carnegie Hall in New York, Manaus Opera House in Brazil, and National Recital Hall in Taiwan.

Self-described as a lifelong learner and explorer, his recording projects reflect his wideranging interests. Through his discography, René seeks to expand the guitar repertoire frequently performing new arrangements, lesser-known music of the 20th century as well as world premieres of concertos and new compositions.

As an educator, René is passionate about engaging the mind and the heart. Through his teachings all around the world, he shares his belief that the greatest musicians not only have the technical mastery to communicate effectively but also are deeply curious, and equally adept at analytical and emotional modes of thought.

Zamba and the folkloric strumming of Argentina with Alejo de los Reyes

Intermediate Workshop - 70 Minutes (bring your guitar)

This workshop will feature a three-part arrangement of a traditional "Zamba" from the North of Argentina (available on the phillyguitar.org website), written by Alejo de los Reyes. To correctly render the arrangement, the workshop will address the topics of leading, playing a second voice to the leading part, and rhythmic accompaniment through the use of the characteristic "rasguido" strumming of South American music, as well as accentuation and articulation on the typical polyrhythmic (3/4 vs 6/8) of the Zamba.

Alejo is one of the world's leading guitarists who combines the many facets of classical guitar with an in-depth knowledge of Argentine folk music. He has emerged as a sought-after international performer who stands out for his creativity and profound musical expressiveness.

Having been described as "technically flawless," David Manzanares-Salguero is a multi-award-winning classical guitarist from Houston, Texas. David has been a finalist and has won first prize in many competitions, including but not limited to the Philadelphia Guitar Competition, Southwest Guitar Symposium, Florida Guitar Festival, Columbus Guitar Symposium, and the Houston Classical Guitar Festival.

One of David's passions is sharing his music with the community through outreach concerts. From 2021-2022, David performed for the Music for a While program at Peabody, aiming to bring music to the Johns Hopkins Hospital. David now has gone on to become the Musician in Residence at the Edenwald Senior Living Community where he performs and curates concert programs on a weekly basis for the independent and assisted living communities.

David is also passionate about finding ways to make higher education more accessible for low-income students. He recently won the competitive Launch Grant from the Peabody Institute to fund the creation of "For the Future," a college readiness program that guides high school classical guitarists facing financial barriers through the college application process. As a supporter and performer of new music, David has collaborated with various composers, particularly those from underrepresented communities, to create new works for solo guitar and guitar ensemble. Recently, David received a Peabody Launchpad Grant to commission underrepresented composers to write guitar duets for the Mina Duo, a guitar duo he started with Gwenyth Aggeler. They will also record these commissions for an upcoming album, aiming to "give a voice to communities that are unheard."

David received his Bachelor's of Music at the Peabody Institute of Music studying with Dr. Thomas Viloteau.




